**I. The Cross (cont'd.)**

**I. How to enter into salvation (cont'd.)**

- 5. Five fingers of God's Word**
  - a. Hearing
  - b. Reading
  - c. Studying—when you can begin to share with others
  - d. Memorizing
  - e. Meditating (Psalm 1)

**II. Two Aspects Of The Cross**

**A. Romans 1:16–18**

- 1. Righteousness, to those who by faith accept Christ's sacrifice on their behalf (Hab. 2:4)
- 2. Wrath to those who reject the truth
  - a. God's attitude to *sin revealed*
  - b. Even Jesus could not commend sin to God

**B. Two alternatives (Rom. 11:19–22)**

- 1. *Goodness* (kindness) or *severity* (Rom. 6:23)
- 2. The cross satisfied God's justice and liberated His grace
- 3. God's grace is sovereign
- 4. Three examples of God's choice:
  - a. Chosen for apostles to—*go* (John 15:16)
  - b. Gentile believers accepted—*bear fruit* (Acts 15:7)
  - c. Saul God's choice—*enduring fruit* (Acts 22:14–15)

**III. What The Cross Did To Satan**

**A. From kingdom of Satan to kingdom of God**

- 1. The two kingdoms (Matt. 12:26–28)

2. Satan rules:
    - a. Humans disobedient to God (Eph. 2:2–3)
    - b. Rebellious angels (Eph. 6:12; Job 41:34)
  3. Delivered and translated (Col. 1:12–13)
    - a. Power = authority
    - b. Transferred by redemption
    - c. Identification with Christ (Eph. 2:4–6)
      - (1) Died
      - (2) Buried
      - (3) Made alive
      - (4) Resurrected
      - (5) Enthroned = we are rulers, kings, priests
- B. Satan defeated and disarmed**
1. “Strong man” and “stronger man” (Luke 11:21–22)
  2. John 12:31–32
    - a. Judgment of this world
    - b. Ruler of this world cast out
      - (1) World = *cosmos* = order of life and culture
      - (2) System on which humanity is based
    - c. Satan cannot go beyond the cross
  3. Col. 2:13–15 (2 Cor. 2:14)

**III. What The Cross Did To Satan (cont'd.)**

- B. Satan defeated and disarmed (cont'd.)**
3. Double provision from guilt (Col. 2:13–15) (compare Is. 53:6)
    - a. Provision for the *past*
      - (1) *Total* forgiveness (Acts 13:38–39)
      - (2) Clean slate
    - b. Provision for the *future*—deliverance from the law as a means of achieving righteousness
      - (1) Under grace (Rom. 6:14; 1 Cor. 15:56)
      - (2) Our fruit depends on our marriage (Rom. 7:1–6)
      - (3) Rom. 10:4
      - (4) Between Jew and Gentile (Eph. 2:14–16; Col. 2:16)
    - c. *Faith* now counted for *righteousness*
      - (1) Stop “working” (Rom 4:3–5)
      - (2) Rom. 4:22–25
- C. Weapons of victory now committed to believers**
1. Spiritual weapons to pull down strongholds (2 Cor. 10:3–5)
  2. The Church at war (Rev. 12:7–11)

#### **IV. Satan's Counterattack**

- A. Galatians 3:1
  - 1. Satan seeks to blind God's people to the cross through witchcraft
  - 2. Results of blindness
    - a. Legalism and carnality
      - (1) Galatians 3:2–3
      - (2) Galatians 3:10–14
      - (3) Jeremiah 17:5
    - b. Regulations bring out fleshly nature (Heb. 9:9–10)

#### **V. Nature Of Witchcraft**

- A. Definitions of occult
  - 1. Witchcraft: Imposing your will on others; operates by curses and spells
  - 2. Divination: Fortune-telling, finding lost objects
  - 3. Sorcery: Charms, amulets, potions, drugs, music
- B. Allied to rebellion (1 Sam. 15:23)
  - 1. Rebellion is like the sin of witchcraft
  - 2. Stubbornness is like idolatry
  - 3. Enforces illegitimate rule
- C. Two descriptions of witchcraft
  - 1. A work of the flesh (Gal. 5:19–20)
    - a. Old Adam seeks to regain his lost dominion (Gen. 1:28)
    - b. Key words
      - (1) Manipulation
      - (2) Intimidation
      - (3) Domination
    - c. Various areas
      - (1) Family relationships
        - (a) Child dominating parent
        - (b) Woman dominating husband
        - (c) Father dominating child
      - (2) Teacher/pupil
      - (3) Pastor/congregation

#### **V. Nature Of Witchcraft (cont'd.)**

- C. Two descriptions of witchcraft (cont'd.)
  - 1. A work of the flesh (cont'd.)
    - c. Various areas (cont'd.)
      - (4) Preacher building his ministry (Gen. 22:10)
  - 2. An evil spiritual power (Gal. 3:1)
    - a. *Emanates* from Satan and his rebellious angels
    - b. Satan's way of establishing his dominion
    - c. The *natural religion* of fallen man

- d. Includes every form of *occult practice*

## VI. God's Protection Against Witchcraft (Gal. 4:1–11)

### Fivefold Deliverance

- A. Deliverance from this present evil age (Gal. 1:4)
  - 1. Two meanings of age: (2 Pet. 3:5–6)
    - a. *Ion* = age = period of time
    - b. *Cosmos* = world = sociological order
  - 2. Reasons
    - a. This present age is coming to a close (Matt. 13:39–40, 49; James 5:7–8)
    - b. Satan is the god of the present age (2 Cor. 4:3–4)
    - c. We have tasted the powers of the next age (Heb. 6:4–6; 2 Cor. 1:21–22)

## VI. Fivefold Deliverance (cont'd.)

- A. Deliverance from this present evil age (cont'd.)
  - 2. Reasons (cont'd.)
    - d. This age causes *worries* that make believers unfruitful (Matt. 13:22)
    - e. Believers must not be conformed to this age (Rom. 12:2)
    - f. A faithful servant of Christ cannot love the present age (2 Tim. 4:10)
  - 3. Results of this deliverance
    - a. Citizenship in heaven (Phil. 3:17–20)  
Determined by acceptance or rejection of the cross
    - b. No continuing city
      - (1) Hebrews 13:14
      - (2) 1 Corinthians 15:19
    - c. Expectation of Christ's return
      - (1) Eagerly waiting (Heb. 9:28)
      - (2) Love His appearing (2 Tim. 4:8)
- B. Deliverance from the law
  - 1. To live for Christ, you must die to the law (Gal. 2:19)
  - 2. When Christ died, we died (Col. 2:20–23)
  - 3. Results of this deliverance
    - a. Freedom from condemnation (Rom. 8:1–4)
      - (1) The law diagnoses the problem
      - (2) Jesus the sin offering
      - (3) Fulfill the righteous requirement of the law: love
        - (a) Revelation 19:7–8
        - (b) Romans 13:8–10
        - (c) Galatians 5:6
        - (d) Galatians 5:14
        - (e) 1 Timothy 1:5
        - (f) James 1:25; 2:8, 12
      - (4) Love united with obedience
    - b. Freedom to be led by the Spirit (Rom. 6:14)
      - (1) Not slaves, but sons (Rom. 8:14–15)
      - (2) Not under law if led by Spirit (Gal. 5:18)
